Milwaukee's Challenge

he challenges facing Milwaukee are well-known: some of the highest rates of poverty, violence and racial inequities in the nation. These conditions create cycles of adversity and trauma for individuals, families and whole communities.

To break these cycles, people need equitable access to safe housing, food security, healthcare, education and employment. But, they also need **compassion**, **connection** and **opportunities** to heal.

Trauma-Informed Solutions

In 2007, Wellpoint Care Network began working with world-renowned neuroscientist and trauma expert Dr. Bruce Perry to embed Trauma Informed Care into all services.

Trauma Informed Care applies scientific knowledge about human brain development, function and healing to help individuals and communities overcome trauma.

This model shifts the central therapeutic question from "What's wrong with you?" to "What has happened to you, and how can I support you?"

CAMPAIGN OUTCOMES

- Our Mental Health Clinic will be expanded and modernized to meet Milwaukee's huge demand for mental health services, especially for children and adolescents. The new design features treatment spaces equipped for art therapy, occupational therapy, self-regulating practices and family healing.
- Community Gardens and individual family gardening plots where children and adults can learn to grow healthy foods and connect with nature and community.
- The Peace Garden, a quiet natural space for contemplation and healing open to neighbors, staff, therapists and the people in our care.
- Walking paths and other recreational opportunities for safe outdoor exercise.
- Modern work spaces for therapists, social workers and other team members to collaborate and coordinate care.
- Community Social Hall and multiple indoor and outdoor gathering spaces open to the public for connection, collaboration and creation.
- Trauma Informed Care Training Center for sharing our expertise with neighbors, community groups and others seeking to understand and mitigate the impact of trauma.
- Early Childhood Education offered by the YMCA, with other community partners bringing additional services to our neighborhood from the safety and comfort of our campus.

COMMUNITY IMPACT

Compassionate Services

Wellpoint Care Network has cared for Milwaukee children and families for 173 years. Today, we provide services to 5,000 individuals daily, including half of all children, teens and families involved in Milwaukee County's Child Welfare Program. These families have experienced abuse, neglect and family separation — as well as poverty, racism and generational cycles of adversity and trauma.

We are an an international leader in Trauma Informed Care, a practice that acknowledges the profound effects of trauma on the developing brain and addresses them using a proven science-based approach.

Mental Health Services

We offer culturally-sensitive, trauma-informed, in-person and virtual mental health services from our Outpatient Clinic, community-based sites in Milwaukee's central city and dozens of K-12 schools across Southeastern WI. 81% of patients do not have full mental health insurance coverage and 90% are between the ages of 0-19.

Child & Family Wellbeing

We meet the complex needs of infants, children and teens in foster care by providing compassionate care coordination, safe placement and case management. We also train and license nurturing foster and adoptive homes and provide support to achieve reunification when possible.



Training & Consultation

We have provided Trauma Informed Care training to more than 75,000 professionals in health and human services, education, law enforcement and other fields. In turn, these professionals bring more compassion, effectiveness and evidence-based tools to their work, positively impacting countless lives in Wisconsin and beyond.
